

## Pan Cheshire Community Safety Needs Assessment 2015/16 - Recommendations extract

Theme	Recommendations
<b>Anti-social behaviour (ASB)</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue the work of the pan Cheshire strategic ASB group.</li> <li>2. Continue with local area problem solving groups.</li> <li>3. Explore Housing ASB data onto police systems. Example from Liverpool. The scope of the strategic assessment has not incorporated ASB reporting to Housing Associations.</li> <li>4. Ensure all partner agencies have appropriate mechanisms for providing intelligence to the police system and vulnerability assessment process.</li> <li>5. Review the ASB witness process for court action.</li> <li>6. Explore areas of best practice models for addressing ASB and look at consistency of resource across each partnership in relation to need.</li> <li>7. Review the mental health referral process. The statutory threshold is too high and misses the low level mental health issues which contribute to a large proportion of ASB.</li> </ol>
<b>Re-offending</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue with the Reducing reoffending work stream and await implementation of the new performance management framework.</li> <li>2. Consolidate local /pan Cheshire activity on how to respond to the changing profile of substance abuse.</li> <li>3. Address the gap identified around service provision for male perpetrators.</li> </ol>
<b>Domestic Abuse (DA)</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Commission a review of DA affecting older people –intelligence, causal factors, service mapping and impacts of ageing population.</li> <li>2. There is a need for specialist DA interventions for young people (16 – 17 year olds) who harm others in their intimate relationships.</li> <li>3. Undertake the independent review of Perpetrator Programmes across Cheshire to identify best practice.</li> <li>4. Improve data recording to encourage reduction of the 40% ‘not stated’ with regard to ethnicity in police incidents.</li> <li>5. Opportunities to develop a pan Cheshire Domestic Abuse Strategy.</li> <li>6. Continue the work of the regional group to develop common standards of communications and best practice.</li> <li>7. Ensure sustainability of services in light of budgetary pressures</li> <li>8. Ensuring the referral pathway re-communicated to GP’s.</li> </ol>

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Mental Health	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Awaiting outcome of the review of Operation Emblem</li> <li>2. Continue to support the Street Triage Operation Emblem.</li> <li>3. Identify if there are gaps in relation to mental health and overall vulnerability which may not be addressed by complex dependencies project. This links to recommendation 7 under Anti-social behaviour.</li> <li>4. Review learning from the Cheshire West initiative of filling the gap for those with mental health issues who do not qualify for services. This links to recommendation 7 under Anti-social behaviour.</li> </ol>
Modern Day Slavery	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue with and develop multi agency public protection arrangements.</li> <li>2. Continued membership of the Anti-Slavery network.</li> </ol>
Children & Young People	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue with diversionary activity (for young people) where appropriate.</li> <li>2. Explore how to evaluate the impact of such diversionary activity.</li> <li>3. Link key indicators in the Child Sexual Exploitation performance framework to local Community Safety Partnerships.</li> <li>4. Explore further the provision of Youth Offending Service performance data that represents the sub region so that it is consistent (opportunity through the complex dependencies performance framework).</li> </ol>
Hate Crime	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. There is an opportunity to look at hate crime reporting – potential regular data pack that can be produced for each local authority.</li> <li>2. Potential to explore joint strategies (pan Cheshire)</li> </ol>
Malicious communications – horizon scan	<p>There is gap in the picture of online communications, stalking and harassment and it is recommended that;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Consideration be given to a separate analysis to explore these themes further or becomes a key feature in the next assessment.</li> </ol>
Counter Terrorism	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continually develop multi agency working and implementation of new legal requirements.</li> </ol>

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<b>Reducing the Impact of Alcohol Related Harm</b>	<p>Current objective of the Pan Cheshire Reducing Alcohol Related Harm is a consistent approach and implementation where possible of the following, across the Cheshire 'footprint':</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Minimum Unit Price – continued engagement with Merseyside.</li> <li>2. Accident &amp; Emergency (A&amp;E) data recording and sharing that meets the standards of Cheshire West, consistent alcohol qualifiers and specifically the 'Cardiff model' / Licensing requirements.</li> <li>3. Relating to recommendation 2, there is an urgent need to address the current concerns over reliable A&amp;E / Cardiff Model data for all local authorities (this includes CWaC).</li> <li>4. Late night levy's / voluntary agreement schemes ('Ipswich model')</li> <li>5. Referral pathways</li> <li>6. School based interventions – (Education/early intervention)</li> <li>7. Consistent alcohol communications.</li> <li>8. Learning from individually commissioned research around the impacts of alcohol harm from a community safety perspective.</li> <li>9. Encourage full membership of the Pan Cheshire sub group to deliver consistencies and share best practice across the sub region.</li> </ol>
<b>Reducing the impact of drug related harm</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue local activity for evidence gathering around the issue of New Psychoactive Substances (NPS) to address issue around Anti-Social Behaviour, usage with children &amp; young people, prolific priority offenders.</li> <li>2. Continued work to address barriers of moving on for historic opiate users and promote successful treatment services for those being released from prison.</li> </ol>
<b>Road Safety</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Investigate capacity and capability that may exist in each of the partner agencies to undertake statistical analysis of road collision / casualty data.</li> <li>2. Identify if data analysis can be undertaken as a resource contribution to partnership ethos of CRSG.</li> <li>3. Investigate and identify solutions to be able to share qualitative data recorded for each reported road traffic collision incident.</li> </ol>

Theme	Recommendations
Community Safety Public Consultation (Local Authority / CSP Level)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Need to explore how best to capture public perception at a CSP level, which is consistent across Cheshire.</li> <li>2. Opportunity to link in with the Police &amp; Crime Commissioner's Office and Cheshire Constabulary to analyse public surveys/consultation at CSP level.</li> </ol>
Pan Cheshire working	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Continue with work already underway to confirm data sharing agreements for quarterly provision of crime and ASB data that can be analysed at ward/beat level, with geographical coding to enable mapping alongside other partner data sources, by putting this in place all local authorities will have consistent intelligence stream.</li> <li>2. Review separate report provided with regard to the Pan Cheshire way forward and consistent local priority setting and the regional assessment, which includes options for a ranking matrix, better use of 'iQuanta' / benchmarking information.</li> <li>3. Website linking all CSPS, key strategies together.</li> <li>4. Possible commissioning timetable of pan Cheshire and local commissioning arrangements.</li> <li>5. Opportunities for us to look at data and intelligence streams across the authorities (work has commenced in Cheshire Constabulary to explore data streams to each CSP).</li> <li>6. Review current intelligence resource across each CSP area.</li> </ol>
